This is how I will support Retired Teachers

TRS was created in 1937 at a time of great economic stress for our nation. If we could afford it then, we certainly can afford it now.

- I support a defined benefit retirement system, and the promises made to teachers.
- I support an increased state contribution rate to help make the system actuarially sound.
- I support a real cost of living adjustment.
- I support amendment of the WEP and the GPO to allow teachers to receive social security due to them from other jobs covered by social security.

TRS-Care was created in 1985. My father signed it into law. At the time, the discussion was that a more permanent funding mechanism had to be created. For over thirty years, that has not happened.

- I support an insurance program that is affordable. No more raising rates that eat up your annuity. No more deductibles that are sky-high.
- I support a new funding mechanism that is related to the cost of health care, not some unrelated factor like the current statewide payroll.
- I support pre-funding TRS-Care similar to what is done for the TRS system.

Public education is where our state's future begins.

- I support using public funds for public schools. I will veto any voucher funding scheme.
- I support and will invest in strong pre-K programs.
- I support paying teachers like the professionals they are by giving them a \$5,000 raise.
- I support property tax reform that closes tax loopholes currently rigged against homeowners and currently costing Texans \$5 billion per year.
- I support the state as the majority funding source for public education.

It's time, as Sam Houston said, to "do right and risk the consequences."
