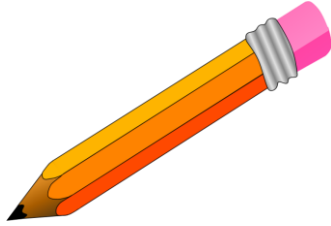

Texas Retired Teachers Association (TRTA)

Founded in 1953, TRTA is the largest association for retired public school and higher education employees and now ranks number one in membership in the nation.

TRTA is the only organization in the state dedicated solely to the preservation of TRS.

Since TRS is prohibited from lobbying the Legislature, TRTA is their voice. The Legislative Committee of TRTA initiates and supports legislation favorable to TRS annuitants and opposes legislation that might be harmful to the solvency of the TRS trust fund.

Teacher Retirement System of Texas (TRS)

TRS was established by the Texas Legislature in 1937. It was established to benefit both the active and retired educators. The current role of TRS is to collect contributions, invest the funds, pay annuitants, and administer TRS-Care. As a state entity, the role of TRS is determined by the Legislature.
