Windfall Elimination Provision Update: Representative Richard Neal (D – Massachusetts) is the new chairman for the Congressional Ways and Means Committee. He has oversight on the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP), which penalizes retired Texas school employees who paid into Social Security before, during or after they worked for public schools. He says he is developing a revised bill to provide meaningful WEP relief to retirees, and will introduce it this summer.

Rep. Neal has worked closely with TRTA in the past. TRTA says it is working every day on WEP, and said big announcements will be coming soon.
