

Many of you have already been using the Zoom application for communicating with your friends and families, and some TRTA local units throughout the state have also begun using the app. Although, for many of us working with technology is a daunting task, be assured that with practice, and some help from your friends, colleagues and even grandchildren, we can overcome! Rogelio Prado, Community Volunteer Services Chair, suggested an old military method, the "buddy system," to facilitate the learning process. Indeed, many have already partnered to practice with the program, after all, we can't break anything, just start experimenting by clicking the buttons. I also have included a link for a Zoom basic video tutorial and have included some text instructions so that we can get started meeting via the Zoom app.

Zoom Instructions for Participants





Before a videoconference:

You will need a computer, tablet, or smartphone with speaker or headphones. You will have the opportunity to check your audio immediately upon joining a meeting.

Youwill receive notice for a video conference or conference call from your committee analyst. The notification will include a link to "Join via computer" as well as phone numbers for a conference call option. It will also include the 9-digit (usually) Meeting ID.

To join the videoconference:

Atthestarttimeofyourmeeting, click on the link in your invitation to join via computer. Youmay be instructed to download the Zoom application.

You have an opportunity to test your audio at this point by clicking on "Test Computer Audio." Once you are satisfied that your audio works, click on "Join audio by computer."

Youmayalsojoinameetingwithoutclickingontheinvitationlinkbygoingto join.zoom.usonany browser and entering the Meeting ID provided by your committee analyst.

If you are having trouble hearing the meeting, you can join via telephone while remaining on the video conference:

On your phone, dial the teleconferencing number provided in your invitation.

Enter the Meeting ID number (also provided in your invitation) when prompted using your touch-tone (DTMF) keypad.

If you have already joined the meeting via computer, you will have the option to enteryour 2- digit participant ID to be associated with your computer

Participant controls in the lower left corner of the Zoom screen:

Using the icons in the lower left corner of the Zoom screen, you can:

Mute/Unmute your microphone (far left)

Turn on/off camera ("Start/Stop Video")

Invite other participants

View Participant list - opens a pop-out screen that includes a "Raise Hand" icon that you may use to raise a virtual hand

Change your screen name that is seen in the participant list and video window

Share your screen

Somewhere on your Zoom screen you will also see a choice to toggle between "speaker" and "gallery" view. "Speaker view" shows the active speaker. "Gallery view" tiles all of the meetingparticipants.
