I hope that you are well and safe. I know some of you have not been out of your house since March. Larry and I have been out and about walking and going to safe places, using healthy guidelines and social distancing as much as possible. We wanted to take the time to send you information on our IRSPA finances, and I also wanted to send you my Annual President's Report, since we did not get to meet in May.

Our wonderful superintendent, Magda Hernandez, reported the state of the district in September and gave our members a chance to ask questions. Dale Howard, our District 10 Legislative Chair and

Representative Terry Meza reported the education victories and challenges in the 2019 legislative session. AMBA was also present to speak to our members about benefits that AMBA offers. Woody Schober and the Silvertones presented their Veterans Program in November and our District President, VaLois Hounsel, also spoke to us a few minutes. December was our Christmas Book Project Auction, at which we raised \$590. In January, we had MacArthur Medical Center physicians present a Healthy Heart Care Program. For February, Jill Bean entertained us with her music and laughter presentation concerning maturing. Eric Yancy from the Irving Police Department informed our members about Cyber Security in March. Unfortunately, we were unable to meet in April and May because of the virus. We were, however, able to celebrate our scholarship winners on May 13 with a drive-by celebration. That same day, we also installed our incoming 2020-2022 officers at Heritage Park.

Anne Bartlett reported that our Christmas Auction raised \$590 for the Book Project.

Evelyn Banks reported that we had over 60 participants at our Retirement Seminar, held at the Irving ISD Board Room in January.

Thenia Haynie, our Volunteer Chair, reported that we had 61,517 hours for the year with six individuals earning the maximum of 4,380 hours each. Those individuals are Myrna Lancaster, Rosemary Robbins, Sue Peddy, Tanya Lee, Katheryn Bush, and Nancy Hutchinson.

Carol Schober reported that IRSPA donated 2,520 books to Irving's elementary students.
