TRTF Talking Points Fall 2021

Initiatives and Goals: What our Foundation Achieves!

- I. Did you know TRTF has given out more than \$800,500 to educators across Texas since 2008? Please help us make a difference in the lives of educators by supporting Foundation Month!
 - a. November 2021 has been designated by the TRTA Board of Directors as Foundation Month.
 - b. TRTF is asking all TRTA local units and districts to designate any meeting this fall to raise funds for Foundation Month.
 - c. All members of TRTA will also receive an annual appeal letter from TRTF in the 3rd quarter issue of *The VOICE*.
 - d. Last year, \$89,000 in donations were received from this fundraising effort!
 - e. This year, TRTF hopes to reach \$100,000 in donations.
 - f. The Foundation's 2021-2022 goals:
 - i. TRTF will provide 20 \$750 Beginning Teacher Scholarships to recent college graduates who will be teaching for the first time in the fall of 2022. TRTF has awarded more than \$124,500 in scholarship funds since 2008.
 - ii. TRTF will provide 30 \$750 Classroom Assistance Grants to public school teachers in Texas in 2022. Since 2008, TRTF has awarded more than \$132,000 in grants for public school teachers.
 - iii. Applications for the Beginning Teacher Scholarship program and the Classroom Assistance Grant program will be available on the TRTF website www.trtf.org for download by September 17, 2021.
 - iv. TRTF will provide \$27,000 in grants to retirees in critical need through the "A Helping Hand" program in 2022. TRTF has provided more than \$210,000 in grants to retired educators since 2010.
 - v. TRTF will provide limited grants through the Disaster Relief Fund as funds allow. We will continue to raise funds for this program to stand ready for the next disaster. In the Spring of 2021, TRTF raised over \$165,000 to assist retired Texas school personnel who were negatively affected by winter storm Uri that struck Texas in February and distributed 663 Disaster Relief grants in aid.

- vi. TRTF will continue to raise funds for the Lehr-Pritchard Endowment Fund, which began in 2016.
 1. All earnings from the endowment fund will be used to support “A Helping Hand” for the foreseeable future, as more and more retirees may be in need of assistance.

TRTF's Programs

IV. "A Helping Hand"

- a. TRTF's program "A Helping Hand" aids public education retirees in critical, emergency need by providing grants. The program has provided over \$210,00 in grants to 210 retirees.
- b. Applications can be requested by contacting the TRTF office at 1.800.880.1650 or sending an email to sarah@trtf.org. **PLEASE NOTE:** Application materials are NOT posted online.
- c. Local unit presidents or foundation representatives can assist an individual seeking help. They may also receive the grant request and forward them to the TRTF office. A committee will review the applications and upon approval, funds will be forwarded directly to a vendor or company to help the retiree pay for a bill or bid.
- d. A list of recipients is not available for the public, as all applications are kept confidential. Only those recipients who give us permission to share their story are revealed. Grants have helped retirees receive space heaters, pay for utilities, medical and dental bills, eyeglasses, food and even a wheelchair. TRTF has also helped purchase hearing aids and dentures.
- e. Recently, our Trustees have been able to refer applicants to an Area Agency on Aging counselor. Some applications that Trustees have reviewed required more help than TRTF was able to provide. Being able to share information about this important resource has provided long-term results for applicants and enhanced their quality of life. V. *Beginning Teacher Scholarships*

- a. TRTF created the Beginning Teacher Scholarship program to replace its Student Scholarship program in 2017. The program provides funds to recent college graduates who plan to become educators in Texas. Applicants must be referred by a member of TRTA. The scholarship assists recipients with paying for certification tests and materials for their very first classroom. The Foundation will award 20 \$750 scholarships in 2022.
- b. Applications will be available on the TRTF website by September 17, 2021 and are due February 25, 2022.

VI. *Classroom Assistance Grants*

- a. Classroom Assistance Grants are awarded to public school teachers who demonstrate a daily commitment to public education and Texas children through the creation of programs, events or other learning platforms. TRTF will provide 30 \$750 classroom assistance grants to public school teachers in Texas in 2022.
- b. Applications will be available on the TRTF website by September 17, 2021 and are due February 25, 2022.

In October 2020, TRTF launched its first ever Tutor Program with our corporate partner and online platform, JoinKnack.com.

Due to recent legislative funding and policy changes, the Texas Retired Teachers Foundation (TRTF) now offers IN-PERSON and online tutoring opportunities with Texas school districts in partnership with the Texas Education Agency (TEA). TRTF is now an approved vendor serving Texas school districts through TEA's High Impact Tutoring Program.

You do NOT need to be a member of TRTA to register as a tutor with this program.

Paid tutor positions with our Texas ISD's are plentiful! You can help students and schools while making additional income, with no penalty to your TRS annuity. In addition, with a few exceptions, there is no limit to the number of hours you may work per month. *Contact TRS if you are working in more than one position, retired after January 1, 2021, or are a disability retiree.*
