2022-2023 Highlights

<u>July 2022</u>

- In-person meetings on the state, district, and local levels continued throughout 2022, while many chapters continued to use virtual meetings as an optional way to meet and conduct business.
- The District Presidents Leadership Conference was held in Pflugerville.
- Standing committees met in Austin to update goals and objectives for the coming year.
- Special Committee Health and Safety was formed.

August 2022

• The TRTA Membership Department launched TRTAPortal for local chapters, replacing TRTAConnect.

September 2022

- The State Legislative Committee created COLA Talking Points for use by chapters and districts ahead of the November election to promote the need for financial relief for TRS retirees.
- The Board of Directors held an in-person meeting in Austin.
- Districts began hosting their fall conferences across the state.

October 2022

- Districts continued hosting their fall conferences across the state.
- TRTA launched a statewide campaign to encourage member participation in the November election.

November 2022

- TRTF promoted its charitable programs to fundraise for Foundation Month.
- TRTA began a campaign to promote the reform of the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP).

December 2022

• Tim Lee and members of the TRTA Board of Directors visited Washington, D.C. to promote the reform of the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP), hosting a press conference on the South Steps of the U.S. Capitol on December 14.

January 2023

- The 88th Legislative Session began on January 10.
- Tim Lee began hosting Facebook/YouTube Live events every Thursday to discuss the latest news and updates during the legislative session (January through May).
- The TRTA Legislative Committee members began making visits to the Capitol to meet with every Senator and Representative to promote TRTA's legislative priorities.
- Registration opened for TRTA Day at the Capitol.
- The Board of Directors held an in-person meeting in Austin.
- The E.L. Galyean Service Award Recipient was named: Mary Ann Dolezal, District 4.

February 2023

- The TRTA and TRTF audit reports were approved.
- The TRTA Legislative Committee continued its Capitol visits throughout the month.

March 2023

- House Bill 600 and Senate Bill 10 were filed in the Texas Legislature, two bills that proposed providing TRS retirees with both a COLA and a supplemental payment.
- Tim Lee and legislative leaders testified at numerous House and Senate hearings.
- TRTF announced its 2023-24 Beginning Teacher Scholarship and Classroom Assistance Grant recipients, providing 22 \$750 scholarships and 30 \$750 grants.

April 2023

• TRTA launched its newly redesigned website, www.trta.org, on April 4.

- TRTA hosted its largest ever attended Day at the Capitol on the East Lawn of the Texas Capitol on April 12, preceded by a special event with guest speaker Ray Perryman on April 11 at the Austin Hilton downtown.
- TRTA announced its state membership awards: At the local chapter level, Beaumont ART in District 6 obtained the highest increase in membership and Collingsworth County RSPA in District 16 achieved the highest percentage increase in membership during this time. At the district level, District 5 grew by the highest number as well as the highest percentage, earning both awards.
- TRTF began its spring Virtual Walk fundraising campaign.
- The Board of Directors held an in-person meeting in Austin.

<u>May 2023</u>

- As the 88th Legislative Session entered its final month, Senate Bill 10 and House Joint Resolution 2 became the vehicles selected by the Legislature to provide a COLA and supplemental payment for hundreds of thousands of TRS annuitants.
- Due to TRTA's strong advocacy efforts, the Texas Legislature appropriated approximately \$5 billion in general revenue designated for COLAs and supplemental payments for eligible TRS annuitants, the largest amount ever appropriated from the state using only general revenue funds for a TRS benefit enhancement.
- TRS annuitants aged 75 and older will receive a one-time supplemental payment in the amount of \$7,500 and TRS annuitants aged 70 to 74 will receive a payment of \$2,400 in September 2023. The \$7,500 stipend will impact approximately 186,000 TRS retirees and the \$2,400 stipend would impact approximately 104,000 TRS retirees.
- Pending the passage of a constitutional amendment in the November 2023 election, TRS annuitants retired September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2020 will receive a 2 percent COLA, TRS annuitants retired September 1, 2001 through August 31, 2013 will receive a 4 percent COLA, and TRS annuitants retired on or before August 31, 2001 will receive a 6 percent COLA. The 2% COLA would impact approximately 150,000 TRS retirees, the 4% COLA would impact approximately 195,000 TRS retirees, and the 6% COLA would impact approximately 75,000 TRS retirees.

In addition:

- The TRTA BOD met seven times in person and virtually sixteen (16) times since July 2022.
- The VOICE, the TRTA news bulletin, was published four (4) times.
- The rebate of \$3.00 per member was paid in May 2023 to the 20 Districts in the total amount of \$269, 175 for the 2022-2023 membership year.
- 67 local chapters received a total of \$7,110, which represented an increase of 711 members over the previous year. Dues revenue increased by a total of \$24,885 because of these additional numbers.
- TRTA membership as of February 28, 2023 was 95,745 members (at–large members 53,903, local members 41,919). TRTA's goal is to reach 100,000 members. This coming year's local membership incentive is The Magic of Membership.
- Contributions by TRTA members for 2022:
 - a) Contributed 5,047,644 hours of community service, valued at \$151 million
 - b) As part of the Children's Book Project and the Student to Student Book Program, 135,963 books were distributed to schools.
- The 2022-2023 "Highest Membership Percentage Gain" was awarded to District 5.
- The 2022-2023 "Highest Membership Gain" was awarded to District 5.
- The 2022-2023 "Highest Membership Percentage Gain" was awarded to Collingsworth County RSPA.
- The 2022-2023 "Highest Membership Gain" was awarded to Beaumont ART.
- In 2022, the Texas Retired Teachers Foundation (TRTF) awarded 18 Beginning Teacher Scholarships in the amount of \$750 each. TRTF has awarded \$138,750 in scholarships since 2008. In April 2023, TRTF awarded 22 \$750 Beginning Teacher Scholarships.
- In 2022, TRTF awarded 30 Classroom Assistance Grants in the amount of \$750 each. TRTF has awarded \$154,500 in grants since 2008. In April 2023, TRTF awarded 30 \$750 Classroom Assistance Grants.
- In 2023, TRTF's charitable program "A Helping Hand" distributed more than \$24,000 to retirees to assist with medical and dental bills, home and auto repairs, and utility bills. Since its inception in 2010, TRTF has awarded over \$271,000 in aid to more than 259 recipients.
